With the loan repayment in full force, enrollment remaining the same and no increase in tuition, finance council and I had to get creative on how to balance the budget. There were two areas that we had to play with. One being staff salaries and the other in replacing the individuals that left. At the time, it was determined that no staff member would receive a raise and that our technology teacher would not be replaced.

Since our staff is amazing, Mrs. Kennison and I looked at ways that we could be creative in helping our staff. We started with her and I returning to the classroom as well as Mrs. Wagner and teaching during the middle school special block. In addition we limited their committee assignments to only one per year which meant that administration would have to pick up more. Finally with the reduction in staff we need to determine a way to cover all duties. Mrs. Kennison and I currently have 11 duties to ensure the teachers only have one per week. **So how can you help?** The teachers recently sent out volunteer forms to their classrooms. Please consider giving of your time and talents to help with them. Please pray for our staff who give so much of themselves.

KENNISON'S CORNER

Dear parents,

Well its official....I am truly an empty-nester. That's right all three of my children are married. My two youngest children got married this summer five weeks apart. Yep they were trying to "kill me". Now that the weddings are over and my house is quiet, I think, "Where did the time go? It has been a blur of the ups and downs, the days of drama or disagreements they had with friends or my favorite, "Mom! You're embarrassing." Many of you may be thinking, "Oh I can't wait until they are older and can do things by themselves or if I survive my middle school child, the rest of my life will be easy!"

So how do we as parents help our kids survive elementary and middle school? Well here are a few things to remember:

- Elementary Kids see everything you do. You are their hero and this is your opportunity to model behaviors like how to respond when you're angry or how do you deal with problems or disagreements.

 Children will do and repeat things you do.
- Elementary kids tend to only see their side of what happened and don't always see events from someone else's perspective. So asking about how the other person felt is a good way to teach understanding and empathy, and we know there are always two sides to every story.
- Elementary kids need to learn problem solving skills. Now this takes a long time to learn and often we as adults still learn something new every day. So teaching kids to look for several solutions rather than thinking there is only one option/solution is the beginning stage to learning to problem solve on their own.
- Middle school age children are challenging and fun all at the same time, but at times you may say, "I don't know who you are; you used to be" So patience is needed but also rules are important. Patience is needed because you will have days that you may want to leave them at school because they are driving you crazy after school. Rules, because if you are not specific, they will interpret your rules to fit their needs, and they don't understand that you are still trying to protect them from themselves.
- Middle school children want to be grown up and will at times act like an adult, but act like a two year old child five minutes later. So having a good relationship with them and letting them know that they can "vent" and talk to you is so important. A wonderful thing to say to your child is, "Are you venting or do you want me to step in and help?" You see kids may be inseparable with a best friend and then come home one day talking about all the things they don't like about their best friend or what they did that was so annoying. This would be a good time to ask, "Are you venting or do you need help with this?" Often they will say I'm just venting.

If I can be of any help, please let me know. It takes a village to raise a child and we are glad you chose St. Malachy to be your village.

Chiara Badano was born on October 29, to Ruggero and Maria Theresa Badano in Sassello, Italy.

The couple waited and prayed 11 years to have Chiara. She was to be their only child.

While Ruggero worked as a truck driver, Maria Theresa stayed at home to raise Chiara.

childhood

Even at the age of four, Chiara seemed aware of the needs of others. She would sort through her toys to give some to poor children, and would never give away just the old or broken



1980

She discovers the Focolare movement. This group, especially its founder's Chiara Lubich, had a profound impact on Chiara's life.

adolescence

She was popular amongst her friends. Chiara loved to hang out in coffee shops. She was great at tennis, swimming and hiking, she loved to sing and dance. Her dream is to become a flight attendant.



sickness

1988

While playing tennis, she felt a sharp pain in her shoulder. It turned out to be bone cancer.

1989

In February, she undergoes her first surgery. She accepts the outcome courageously. "I'm young. I'm sure I'll make it."

In July, the tumour spreads quickly. She loses the use of her legs.



When she suffered, she felt closer to Jesus. She would say, "It's for you, Jesus; if You want it, I want it too."

departure

When Chiara realized that she was not going to get better, she started to plan for her "wedding" (her funeral) with her mother.

She chose the music, songs, flowers, and the readings for Mass. She wanted to be buried in her "wedding dress" a white dress with a pink waist, because her death would allow her to become the bride of Christ. She had also arranged to donate her comeas after her death.

She says to her mother: "Don't shed any tears for me. I'm going to Jesus. At my funeral, I don't want people crying, but singing with all their hearts."

She died on October 7, the Feast Day of the Holy Rosary.



Two days later, hundreds and hundreds of people, especially youths, take part in the funeral celebrated by "her" bishop.

beatification

On September 25, she became the first member of Generation X to be beatified.
